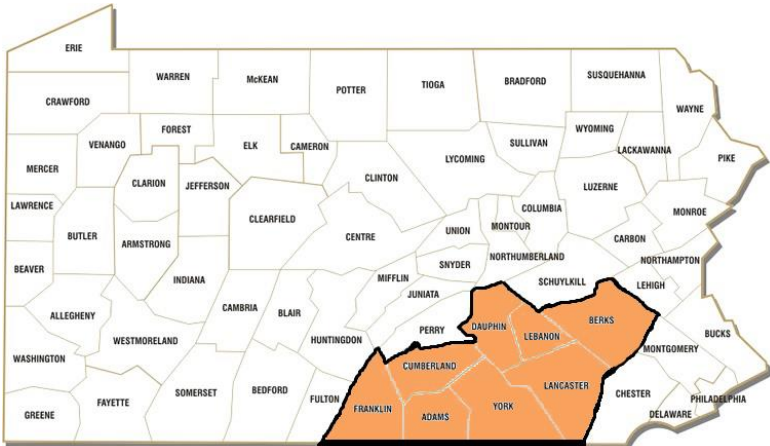




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Annual Analysis of Southcentral PA's Metropolitan Area Exports 2014



August 2015

This report was written to give a snapshot of southcentral Pennsylvania’s export growth in 2014. Every year when the International Trade Administration releases their “Metropolitan Export Series” data, we summarize the information for our region. This provides a comprehensive analysis of where our region lies in relation to the rest of the State’s exports. The southcentral region of Pennsylvania encompasses seven Metropolitan Statistical Areas (MSA), including Chambersburg-Waynesboro, Gettysburg, Harrisburg-Carlisle, Lancaster, Lebanon, Reading, and York-Hanover.

In this report, the term “merchandise export sales” is used to represent the exchange of goods from metropolitan areas, as defined by the Census Bureau. 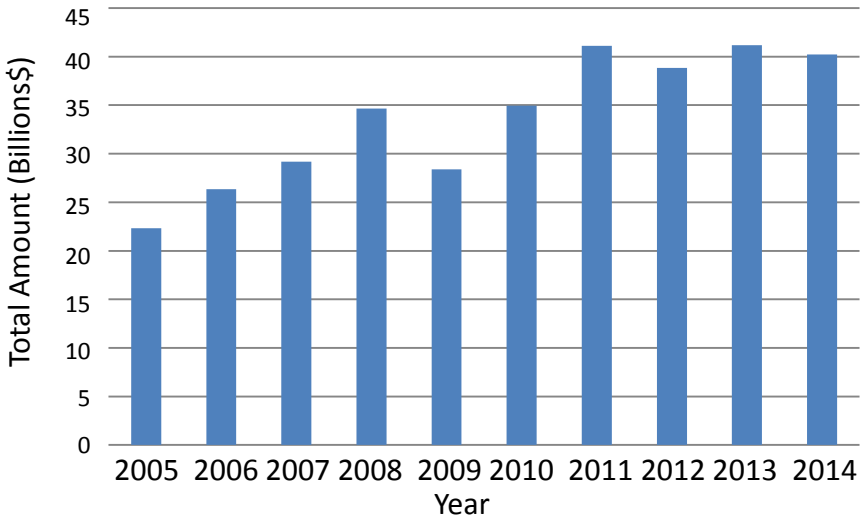
Southcentral Pennsylvania's Metropolitan Statistical Areas Export Sales Continue to Grow

The seven southcentral Pennsylvania metropolitan statistical areas grew their exports by \$2.6 billion since 2010, reaching a total of \$ 9.1 billion in 2014. Since 2005, the region's export sales have increased by over 166%. During the same time period, Pennsylvania's overall merchandise export sales increased by 80% since 2005. Additionally, the southcentral region's share of total PA exports has increased steadily since 2012, ending with a 22.6% share in 2014.



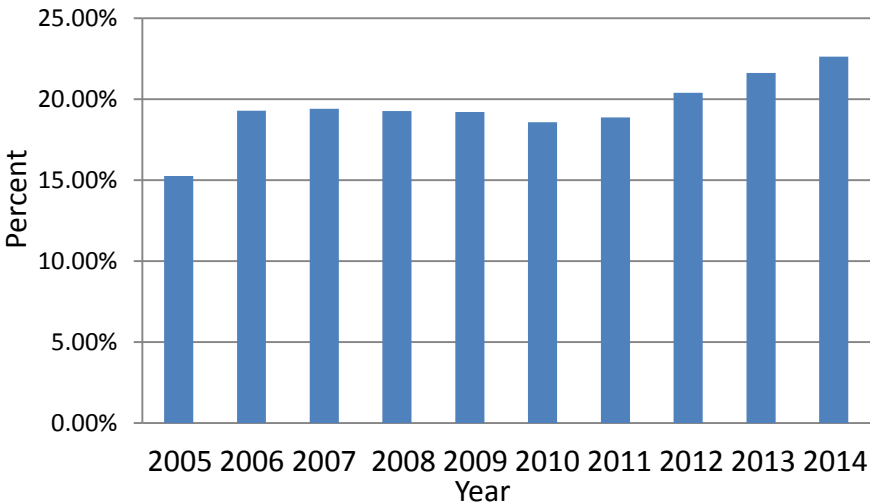

Pennsylvania Metropolitan Statistical Area Rankings

Not only has the southcentral Pennsylvania region consistently increased in metropolitan export sales, but it has also stayed competitive in ranking against other US metropolitan areas. In 2005, Harrisburg-Carlisle area ranked 128 out of 372 national metro areas, with \$824,061,571 in export sales. In 2014, Harrisburg-Carlisle significantly increased to rank 79 out of 386 national metro areas, with \$3,052,760,144 in export sales. The other top MSA's in 2014 are the York-Hanover area, ranked 102 with \$2,024,304,131 in export sales, and the Reading area, ranked 114 with \$1,742,551,789 in export sales, respectively.

The chart below notes each MSA for the southcentral Pennsylvania region with their respective national rankings and total export sales for 2005 and 2014, to show a comparison.

Pennsylvania’s Top 5 Export Destinations and Top 10 Industries

In 2014, the top five markets Pennsylvania companies exported their products to include Canada, Mexico, China, United Kingdom and Netherlands. Canada, continuing to rank as our top main trading partner, experienced a 3% increase in PA products from 2013 to 2014. Additionally, Mexico also increased during the past year. The country that experienced the largest percent increase in exports is the United Kingdom at 31%, surpassing Netherlands, Japan, and Germany to enter the top five export markets in 2014.

Additionally, Pennsylvania’s top five industries for export include chemicals, machinery, transportation equipment, computers and electronics, and metals. The industries that experienced the largest growth include electrical equipment and appliances and food, both at a respective 11% increase.
